Special Agent, **Mike Kuehl** is a eight year veteran of the Illinois State Police. In 2005, Agency Kuehl transferred to the Methamphetamine Response Team, a unit designed to investigate, seize and dismantle clandestine methamphetamine laboratories. His certifications for meth includes Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response to Clandestine Meth Labs as well as Site Safety Officer Training.

**Randall Webber**, M.P.H. Director, External Training & GLATTC Center of Excellence in Criminal Justice TASC, Inc. of Illinois and an adjunct faculty member in the Department of Psychology at Loyola University of Chicago. He has spent the last 36 years in the substance abuse field, and has published and lectured widely throughout North America on the subjects of substance abuse prevention, street drug pharmacology, addiction science and the treatment of drug dependency. Randy earned a Bachelors degree in psychology and a Master of Public Health from the University of Illinois at Chicago.

#### Presentation Highlights:

**Methamphetamine Awareness:** Presentation highlights will focus on methamphetamine awareness and the exponential spread of meth production and meth use, recognizing meth laboratories, hazards of meth labs, and the effects of meth on users, children, and on the community.

**How to Keep Kids from Using Meth:** This workshop will focus on approaches to the prevention of alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, with a particular emphasis on methamphetamine. The role of the individual, family, schools and community will be discussed and levels of prevention activities will be described. In addition, risk and resiliency factors for individuals, families and communities will be described.
