



The 28th Annual Prevent Child Abuse Illinois Conference was held in Springfield on October 13-14, 2022 and offered access to national speakers in the field of child abuse prevention and intervention. Trauma educator and advocate Tonier Cain kicked off Day One with an inspiring plenary presentation on her personal journey to resilience before the morning workshop sessions.

PCA Illinois was thrilled to present the Friend of Children Award to our former Executive Director Roy Harley at the Awards Luncheon on Day One. Plenary Speaker Dr. Ira Chasnoff started Day Two with his session on intervention strategies that can promote a positive relationship between mother and child. Gaelin Elmore closed out the conference by energizing attendees with his challenge to have "the courage to overreact" when working with survivors of trauma. In all, over 500 attendees took advantage of conference workshop sessions, resource tables, networking opportunities, and more.

The Home Visiting Illinois Summit was back in Springfield on October 12, 2022 and hosted over 150 attendees. Plenary Speaker Jennifer Silliman spoke on her personal struggles with postpartum anxiety which inspired her to produce a documentary addressing motherhood and mental illnesses called *The Dark Side of the Full Moon.* Attendees were able to view this documentary and then engaged in a follow-up discussion before the Home Visiting Celebration dinner that evening.


