The board of directors and staff of Prevent Child Abuse Illinois are pleased to present our 2012 Annual Report highlighting the key activities and accomplishments of the past year.

There is nothing more important to the well being and future of our nation than the well being and future of our children. The long term damaging effects of child abuse and neglect are well known through such studies as the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) research from Kaiser Permanente, the Center for Disease Control, and others. And in 2012, the direct and indirect financial costs of child abuse were put at upwards of \$80 billion in a recent analysis out of the University of Pennsylvania. The direction is clear. We have to invest in the well being of our children.

Investing in children has a huge payoff. At our child abuse prevention conference this year, "Safe and Healthy Children, Making the Investment", keynote speaker Dr. Arthur Rolnick laid out the clear case for investing in children - in early education, in health services, in child care, in parent support programs and more.

Every child must have a safe, secure, stable, and healthy home and community.

Prevent Child Abuse Illinois remains firmly committed to this cause and to this effort. Despite the daunting economy, we have found ways to continue our full range of prevention efforts and even to expand in some areas. ## Child Abuse Prevention Month



The 2012 Child Abuse Prevention Month Campaign, "Every Child Matters . . . Get Involved!" was a call to action. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff facilitated and attended events, conducted trainings, workshops and presentations, and provided extensive community support during the month of April. We updated and expanded our Prevention Month Community Packet, produced a Statewide Calendar of over 80 events, and facilitated Public Awareness Launch events in Northern, Central and Southern Illinois. Each of those events featured a 2012 Child Abuse Prevention Community Award recognizing an organization in that region for its exemplary child abuse prevention community awareness campaign.

**Literature Distribution** - The Prevent Child Abuse Illinois Literature Distribution Program provides educational materials on child abuse prevention and related topics at no cost to individuals and organizations throughout Illinois. In 2012 more than 55,000 pieces of literature in both English and Spanish were distributed to hospitals, clinics, public health departments, schools and social service agencies. These organizations provide the material to Illinois families in their own communities teaching child abuse prevention and positive parenting.



**Shaken Baby Syndrome** (Abusive Head Trauma) - Anyone can become overwhelmed when a baby won't stop crying. Violently shaking an infant or young child is one of the most tragic responses that a parent or caretaker might make in this stressful situation and can result in severe life changing injuries or even death. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois' Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention Campaign provides public awareness, print materials, and training to teach ways to understand the danger and prevent this tragedy. In 2012, over 26,000 educational brochures were distributed in English and Spanish and six workshops were given across the state training others to provide this education in their communities.



**Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Program** - High profile cases of child sexual abuse have recently raised public consciousness and concern about this issue. Prevention is critical and an informed adult community is the best safeguard. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois has continued to expand its reach with the "Stewards of Children" evidenced based training curriculum by increasing the number of workshops offered and by helping communities to train their own facilitators. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff also served on the Governor's Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children (Erin's Law) charged with addressing this issue and specifically including age appropriate curriculum for students in pre-K through 5th grade.



**Effects of Domestic Violence on Children** - Prevent Child Abuse Illinois continued its close partnership with other advocates and organizations working to eliminate the risk of the serious harmful effects of domestic violence on children. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff provided trainings and support materials, chaired committees, and distributed over 6,000 Effects of Domestic Violence on Children brochures across the state.



**Effects of Methamphetamine and Other Drugs on Children** - Recent trends in the growing use of heroine and the abuse of prescription drugs in Illinois are a new part of the Prevent Child Abuse Illinois Effects of Methamphetamine and Other Drugs on Children program. The harm to children living in homes where drugs are sold, used, or manufactured is devastating and can have life long effects. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff served as anti-drug coalition members, committee chairs, conference planners, and community trainers in 2012 and distributed over 1,500 brochures.

## Home Visitation Support Services



Prevent Child Abuse Illinois has provided key leadership for the Healthy Families Illinois home visiting program for new parents since 1994 through statewide planning, advocacy, staffing regional program clusters, and managing a credentialing support fund. That effort expanded two years ago with the Strong Foundations Project and the inclusion of Nurse Family Partnership, Early Head Start, Parents as Teachers, and other home visiting programs into a single collaborative effort. In 2012 the effort continued to grow with funding through the new federal Affordable Care Act.

## Reducing Parental Stress



The Happiest Baby on the Block Initiative teaches new parents and caregivers Dr. Harvey Karp's five sure fire techniques for soothing a crying infant. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff trained hundreds of new parents in 2012 and facilitated certification training for over 20 new trainers throughout the state. Use of these techniques reduces parental stress and helps foster a healthy parent child relationship.

## PREVENTION AWARENESS AND ADVOCACY

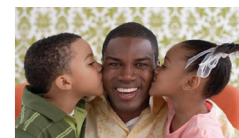
### Advocacy

Working with our national and state partners, advocacy efforts in 2012 focused largely around budget issues in Illinois. We also worked in support of Home Visiting Programs, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Erin's Law on sexual abuses prevention, and Marsy's Law on crime victim's rights. In 2012, Prevent Child Abuse Illinois completed adoption of the five major Prevent Child Abuse America policy statements on promoting child development by supporting families and on preventing child physical abuse, child emotional abuse, child sexual abuse, and child neglect.

### Annual Child Abuse Prevention Conference

Attended by over 400 participants, the annual conference is one of the state's largest training events for child welfare professionals, foster and adoptive parents, community volunteers, and related health and social service professionals.



### Child Abuse Prevention Coalitions

Active, engaged, and supportive communities are essential to the quality of family life and the health and well being of children. Prevent Child Abuse Illinois is helping to establish Child Abuse Prevention Coalitions working to identify and address community needs on a local level. Thirteen coalitions are now meeting regularly across the state serving communities in twenty-eight counties with the help of Prevent Child Abuse Illinois staff and resources.
